Day 1: 18 March 2017 Arrive Bangkok (-)

Arrival in Bangkok.

Meet and greet with our local guide then transfer to hotel.

Overnight in Bangkok.

Day 2: 19 March 2017 Bangkok (B/L)

Breakfast at hotel.

Bangkok Highlights: City/Temples & Klong Tour (incl. lunch)

Visit two of the most important sights of Bangkok: the Reclining Buddha at **Wat Pho** is a giant lying Buddha, covered in gold leaf. **The Grand Palace** is a "must see" for every visitor. Located close to the banks of the Chao Phraya River the Grand Palace is the perfect example of an ancient Siamese court. Within the compound is the Temple of Emerald Buddha (**Wat Pra Kaew**). Lunch will be served in a Thai restaurant. Travel on the Chao Phraya River (the River of Kings) and on through the **Klongs** (canals) of Thonburi. You will have the chance to observe and photograph the serene family homes and temples along the waterways, which gave the city the name "Venice of the East." You will, also pay a visit to one of the most photographed sights in Bangkok, the **Wat Arun**. The majestic shrine has a pagoda of 76 meters high. It is decorated with glazed ceramic pieces that reflect the rising sun and gave the temple its name.

**Duration:** may vary from 5.5 - 7 hrs.

Pick up time from the hotel: 08:30 a.m. (if no other time announced by the guide)

Important: Please note that you are required to wear proper attire (no bare shoulders, bare knees, or strapless-

heel shoes). Shoes must be removed before entering all temple buildings.

Overnight in Bangkok.

Day 3: 20 March 2017 Bangkok (B/L)

Breakfast at hotel.

#### Ayutthaya Tour by bus & boat (incl. lunch)

In the morning, leave Bangkok for **Ayutthaya**, the ancient Siamese capital. Today, Ayutthaya hosts some of Thailand's most important historical landmarks and is part of the UNESCO World Heritage. The magnitude and number of the ancient temple ruins speaks of the former greatness of the city. You will visit some of the most interesting temples and nearby Bang-Pa-In. The **Bang-Pa-In Summer** Palace of King Rama V consists of buildings in Gothic, Renaissance, Chinese and Thai architecture.

Cruise back to Bangkok along the Chao Phraya River aboard a river cruiser. In route you can observe the scenic river life as you enjoy a sumptuous buffet lunch. Return to your hotel in the late afternoon.

Duration: 8-9 hrs.

**THAILAND ITINERARY (subject to change)** 

Day 4: 21 March 2017

Bangkok - Chiang Mai (B/L)

Breakfast at hotel.

Transfer from hotel to Bangkok Airport for flight to Chang Mai. You will be able to leave your large luggage at the Bangkok hotel to be picked up when you return from Chang Mai on the 23<sup>rd</sup>.

#### DO NOT LEAVE ANY VALUABLES IN THE LUGGAGE LEFT AT THE BANGKOK HOTEL

Arrive at Chiang Mai airport then transfer to hotel.

Pick up from the hotel for lunch at local restaurant. After lunch takes you around the famous city for an up-close and personal look at some of its most notable temples, as well as stops at its old city walls, gates, and moat. Highlight of this trip include **Wat Pan Tao**, built in the typical wooden northern-Thailand architecture, with exquisite fine carving on the eaves and door. Proceed to **Wat Jet Yod** with its seven spires and incredible architecture commemorating the year 2000 of the Buddha era. Then drive up to Doi Suthep to visit **Wat Phra Dhat Doi Suthep** (built in A.D. 1384). Wat Doi Suthep is the most sacred temple in northern Thailand, containing a holy relic of Lord Buddha.

**Evening:** Your guide will escort you through the labyrinth of stalls selling everything from local crafts to fun imitation goods. Choose from an astonishing variety of souvenirs, sample the smoothness of the colorful silk on sale everywhere, have a suit measured and ready for your collection the following evening, and browse exquisite Asian silver jewelry and beads. A great way to practice your bargaining skills!

Overnight in Chiang Mai.

Day 5: 22 March 2017 Chiang Mai (B/L)

Breakfast at hotel.

The **Mae Sa Elephant Camp** is located just north of Chiang Mai and is a wonderful place to see these amazing mammals receive their daily training, perform traditional duties amidst the trees of the forest and take baths in the cool, nearby streams. Then ride the elephant through the jungle about 1 hr (2 persons per 1 elephant) to visit the variety hill tribe villages at **Eco Agricultural Tourism**. Take a time to touch hill tribe life includes with White Karen, Lahu, Palong, and Padong (Kayang or Longneck Karen). Lunch will be provided at local restaurant. This tour also includes a peaceful visit to a large orchid nursery and a butterfly farm on the way back to your hotel.

This evening, enjoy the superb **Khantoke Northern Thai Dinner** with charming Fon Lep (fingers dance), Sword Dance, Fon Thien (candle dance), Ramwong which all guests will be invited to participate. Also, there is special hill tribe show performed by Akha, Yao, Lahu, Meo, Lishaw, and Karen tribes.

Day 6: 23 March 2017 Chiang Mai – Bangkok (B)

Breakfast at hotel.

Transfer to Chiang Mai airport for flight back to Bangkok.

The Pre-Existing Condition Exclusion will be waived if the protection plan is purchased before final trip payment for the trip, for the full non-refundable cost of the trip and the booking for the covered trip is the first and only booking for this travel period and you are not disabled from travel at the time you pay the premium

#### **DETAILS OF COVERAGE**

Insurance benefits will be paid up to the Maximum Benefit Amount purchased to cover You for the Published Penalties and usused non-refundable prepaid expenses for Travel Arrangements when You are prevented from taking or completing Your Covered Trip due to:

- a) Your or a Family Member's or a Traveling Companion's or a Business Partner's death, which occurs before departure on Your Trip;
- Your or a Family Member's or a Traveling Companion's or a Business Partner's covered Sickness or Injury, which:

   a) occurs before departure on Your Trip, b)requires Medical Treatment at the time of cancellation resulting in medically imposed restrictions, as certified by a Legally Qualified Physician, and c) and prevents Your participation in the Trip;
- c) You or Your Traveling Companion being hijacked, quarantined, required to serve on a jury (notice of jury duty must be received after Your Effective Date), served with a court order to appear as a witness in a legal action in which You or Your Traveling Companion is not a party (except law enforcement officers);
- d) Your or Your Traveling Companion's primary place of residence or destination being rendered uninhabitable by fire, flood, burglary or other Natural Disaster. The Company will only pay benefits for Losses occurring within 30 calendar days after the Natural Disaster makes your destination accommodations uninhabitable. Your destination is uninhabitable if: the building structure itself is unstable and there is a risk of collapse in whole or in part; (ii) there is exterior or structural damage allowing elemental intrusion, such as rain, wind, hail, or flood; (iii) immediate safety hazards have yet to be cleared such as debris on roofs or downed electrical lines; or (iv) the rental property is without electricity or water. Benefits are not payable if a storm, snow storm, blizzard or hurricane is named on or before the Effective Date of Your Trip Cancellation coverage;
- e) a documented theft of passports or visas
- f) You or Your Traveling Companion being directly involved in a traffic accident, substantiated by a police report, while en route to Your scheduled point of departure;
- g) Bankruptcy or Default of an airline, cruise line, tour operator or other travel provider (other than the Travel Supplier, tour operator or travel agency, from whom You purchased Your Travel Arrangements causing a complete cessation of travel services more than 14 days following Your Effective Date. Benefits will be paid due to Bankruptcy or Default of an airline only if no alternate transportation is available. If alternate transportation is available, benefits will be limited to the change fee charged to allow You to transfer to another airline in order to get to Your intended destination. This benefit only applies if the Certificate has been purchased within 14 days of the date Your initial deposit/payment for Your Trip is received; and You insure the full cost of Your Trip subject to penalties or restrictions;
- h) unannounced Strike that causes complete cessation of services for at least 18 consecutive hours of the Common Carrier on which You are scheduled to travel;
- i) Inclement Weather that causes complete cessation of services for at least 18 consecutive hours of the Common Carrier on which You are scheduled to travel;
- felonious assault of You or Your Traveling Companion within 10 days of the Scheduled Departure Date;
- k) You or Your Traveling Companion is in the military and called to emergency duty for a national disaster other than war;
- 1) involuntary employer termination or layoff affecting You or a Traveling Companion. Employment must have been with the same employer for at least 1 continuous year;
- a Terrorist Incident that occurs within 30 days of Your Scheduled Departure Date in a city listed on the itinerary of Your Trip. This same city must not have
  experienced a Terrorist Incident within the 90 days prior to the Terrorist Incident that is causing Your cancellation of Your Trip. Benefits are not provided if the Travel
  Supplier offers a substitute itinerary;
- n) Your family or friends living abroad with whom You were planning to stay are unable to provide accommodations due to life threatening illness, life threatening injury or death of one of them;
- o) Your normal pregnancy or attending the childbirth of Your Family Member. The pregnancy must occur after the Plan Effective Date and be verified by medical records:
- p) the primary or secondary school that You, Your Family Member or Traveling Companion attends continues classes beyond the predefined school year, due to unforeseeable events which: 1) occur after Your Effective Date for Trip Cancellation; and 2) cause the classes to extend beyond the Scheduled Departure Date of Your Trip. Extensions due to extra-curricular or athletic events are not covered;
- q) Mandatory evacuation ordered by local government authorities at Your Trip Destination (or official public evacuation notices or recommendations without a mandatory evacuation order issued) due to adverse weather or Natural Disaster;
- r) A transfer of You or Your Traveling Companion by the employer by whom You or Your Traveling Companion are employed on Your Effective Date which requires their principal residence to be relocated;
- s) You, Your Traveling Companion or a Family Member traveling with You is required to work during the Trip. A written statement by an unrelated company official and/or the human resources department demonstrating revocation of previously approved time off will be required;
- t) You, Your Traveling Companion or Family Member traveling with You are directly involved in the merger of Your employer or the acquisition of Your employer by another company. You, Your Traveling Companion or Family Member cannot be a company owner or partner;
- u) Your or Your Traveling Companion's place of employment is rendered unsuitable for business due to fire, flood, burglary or other Natural Disaster and You and/or Your Traveling Companion are required to work as a result.

All cancellations must be reported directly to the Travel Supplier within 72 hours of the event causing the need to cancel, unless the event prevents it, and then as soon as is reasonably possible.

Trip Delay: The Insurer will reimburse You for covered expenses on a one time basis, up to the maximum shown in the Schedule of insurance and other coverages, if You are delayed en route to or from the Covered Trip for 6 or more hours due to a covered reason.

Baggage/Personal Effects: The Insurer will reimburse You up to the maximum shown on the Schedule of insurance and other coverages for loss, theft, or damage to Baggage and Personal Effects. The Insurer will pay the lesser of the following: Actual Cash Value at the time of the loss, less depreciation as determined by the Insurer, or the cost of repair or replacement.

Emergency Accident and Sickness Medical Expense: The Insurer will pay benefits up to the maximum shown on the Schedule of insurance and other coverages, if You incur Covered Medical Expenses for Emergency Medical Treatment as a result of an Accidental Injury which occurs on the Covered Trip or a Sickness which first manifests itself during the Covered Trip.

Emergency Medical Evacuation: The Insurer will pay, subject to the limitations set out herein, up to the maximum shown on the Schedule of insurance and other coverages, for Covered Emergency Evacuation Expenses reasonably incurred if the Insured suffers an Injury or Emergency Sickness that warrants the Insured's Emergency Evacuation while on a Trip.

Cancel For Any Reason Protection: Optional Coverage applies only when requested on the application and the appropriate additional plan cost has been paid. CFAR must be purchased at the time of plan purchase and within 14 days of your initial trip deposit. If You purchase the Cancel For Any Reason protection and You cancel Your Trip for any reason not otherwise covered by this plan, the Insurer will reimburse You for up to 75% of the prepaid, forfeited, non-refundable payments or deposits You paid for Your Trip provided You cancel Your Trip more than 48 hours prior to your Scheduled Departure Date. This benefit is not available to residents of New York State.
